

<u>BIBLICAL ARCHAEOLOGY MINISTRIES</u>

By the time you get this report, I will be in Israel, joining the excavation team at Tel Shiloh where we are digging up biblical history during another season of archaological discovery in the Holy Lands. Already, the team has made some amazing discoveries - the footprint of the Old Testament Tabernacle, the gate where Eli the priest sat when he got the news about the ark of the covenant, thousands of bones of sacrificial animals, and countless artifacts. I and Dr. Bobby Sparks have also been invited to meet with the Israel Antiquities Authority in Jerusalem to tour their facilities and meet with the director. We will be



staying in Jerusalem and traveling to Shiloh (which lies in the West Bank) each day. Please pray for safety as we make this journey. I am currently working on curriculum for a course in Biblical Archaeology I will be teaching in the fall at Emmaus, part of a new degree program in Near-Eastern History and Archaeology.

It is encouraging to see what the Lord is doing in this area of the world! Thank you for your prayers and continued support for this ministry.
